Lying to Get Out of Trouble

Julia, 10 is adopted. She lies to impress others.

Pathological Lying

Armand, 17, a foster child, lies about everything even when the truth is obvious.

- What he gains from lying
- Using communication styles that reduce the opportunity to lie
- Promoting healthy self-assertion

Lying to Get Others in Trouble

Allie, 7, lies to stir up trouble with other kids and then tattles to her foster mom about the trouble.

- What she gains from the lying
- How to give her what she needs in a healthier way
